


sheep - all played by families decked out with the props they've made!

**Missions**. We began supporting three new missionaries this year. We hosted *Perspectives*, which is a world/local mission course. Those who attended gained a deeper understanding of God's desire to reach the lost and are motivated to be involved in ministry and mission. A team ministered again on the streets of *Mexico City* through *MEFI*. A student ministries team ministered among the poor in Memphis through *Street Reach*. Closer to home, we participate in *Project Transformation*, a reading program at *Council Grove* elementary, a service project at *Overholser Elementary*, the *Food Bank*, *Skyline Urban* ministry, *Youth and Family Service* at Yukon, and packed food to send around the world through *Stop Hunger Now. Faith Promise* continues to be a successful and significant funding mechanism to support mission work. This year we are able to increase *UM apportionment* support as we move back toward 100%. Additionally, *UMW* participates in several mission projects and involves the congregation in several fundraisers to support various UMW global mission efforts. *Kings & Queens* ministry with families who have special needs children has taken root. Attendance and volunteer participation is growing. We have already reached our 2015-2016 goal and are looking beyond it. We are thankful for the *NPNP conference grant* that helps us launch and staff this caring ministry with talented people with specialized training.

**Stephen Ministry** continues to wonderfully share Jesus' love with people during transitional times of life. We have hosted city-wide and regional events. Ministry recipients include people outside our membership. SM trained servants also assist by making hospital visits.

**Outreach** efforts are broad and diverse. We have held open-to-neighbors *picnics/parties* at a nearby park and on our lawn. A guest recently shared that while dining at a local restaurant, some of our members introduced themselves and invited them to attend again. We moved a VBS style event, *Bible Club*, to the local park so that neighborhood children could attend without needing transportation. We continue to bring children from nearby apartment complexes to church onboard *church vans*. This summer we started a *Sunday morning breakfast* for hungry kids who arrive on the vans. We held multiple *movie nights* on the lawn and invited the neighborhood. *Second Winders* continues to attract friends for fellowship and fun. Our most effective outreach efforts continue to be *members personally inviting un-churched* acquaintances and friends to worship services and other events.

**Financials:** St. Mark's enjoys a history of strong and committed financial support from a broad base of congregational donors. The past 30 months have witnessed a significant decrease in donations. It appears this is the result of macro-economic factors, expensive government policies, and a weakening employment market. The greatest impact of the change in financial support was absorbed by reducing staff size, salary freezes/decreases, cutting benefits, and reducing the percentage of apportionments we paid. While the global conditions may or may not be improving, St. Mark's appears to have bottomed out and we are beginning to show signs of renewed stability. At this time, we are making service and financial commitments for 2016. The level of giving to St. Mark's appears to be increasing for 2016. As each member is involved are ministries are better funded.

**Discipleship** is a strong root at St. Mark's. Sunday and Wednesday classes and studies are the backbone. They include all ages and a wide range of topics. *Bible Study Fellowship* has a positive impact on the lives of members.

**Mission Strategy**. We tweaked our mission statement to read "To build a family of believers who glorify God and help each other become fully devoted followers of Jesus Christ." Our mission strategy may undergo refinement. In 2016, we will participate in the SHIFT consulting process with other churches in the district to better define, target and revise our mission strategy.

I am looking forward to ministry with each of you in 2016 as we serve Jesus Christ together.
