



Life Groups of St. Mark's

Life Groups is small group ministry launching in the Fall of 2018. Life Groups meet anywhere, anytime and anyway people would like to get together. The name refers to a family of friends with whom you can share our lives and grow in faith. Life Groups provide time to join other sisters and brothers who are also trying to follow Jesus. The purpose of Life Groups is to help each of us strengthen as disciples of Jesus Christ.

Life Groups may meet as often as weekly or as infrequently as monthly as decided by participants.

Life Groups include four personal growth elements gathered around the cross



1) Mission & Ministry

Plan a mission or ministry to accomplish within an agreed timeframe – both personal and group plans are shared.

Your Life Group may be a Mission team.

2) Prayer/Relationship

Share prayer needs related to conquering sin and experiencing spiritual transformation.

Experiment with types and ways of praying that are described in Scripture.

3) Study Scripture

This should usually be a study of Scripture.

4) Accountability

Encourage each other to keep striving toward growth goals previously set by the group and individuals.


LOOKING AHEAD:

Outlandish Dreams and Visions

President Kennedy aimed us toward an exceedingly challenging goal, which has been reached, and set us on a journey that has yet to be concluded. Big dreams are like that. JFK's dream did not end on the moon.

There is no shortage of people talking about what can't be done, but few who lead us to stretch to the imagined edge of our capabilities. Sometimes we talk ourselves back from an adventure with promises of comfort or feelings of inadequacy. Yet God can do so much more in us and through us than we can think or imagine.

Paul writes of God's transforming work of grace in the world that culminates fully in three ways: 1. Glory of God, 2. Power of the Holy Spirit in Christians, and 3. Permanent unity of Jesus Christ and the Church. He sums it up this way:

Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work in us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen. Ephesians 3:20-21 (NIV)

Whenever I think of how we are not capable of accomplishing this or that and may have seemingly good reason for it, I try to remember that it is God's glory and power, it is God who is doing this great work through us. He is making himself and his gospel known through the Church, through St. Mark's.

Every move we make toward obeying, loving and understanding God is another step on a wonderful journey. We reach milestones along the way and discover there is even more adventure before us. So don't stop. Move on from your greatest achievement, go beyond your personal "moon landing." There is more to experience and discover. More than we can imagine.
