Pastor's Perspective

Marriage and the US Supreme Court

A recent decision of the US Supreme Court found that laws defining marriage as a relationship between a man and a woman are unconstitutional. The court based its ruling on the equal protection clause of the 14th Amendment to the Constitution of the USA. The court's new definition of marriage is out of step with the laws, practice, and understanding of most civilized societies and cultures for thousands of years as well as the heritage, culture, and traditions of the United States. The definition is also at odds with the definition of marriage as taught by the United Methodist Church.

The United Methodist Church teaches that marriage is an exclusive covenant relationship between one man and one woman. This definition agrees with the teaching of Scripture and Christian tradition. The decision by the court does not affect our teaching and belief. Some are concerned that the court's ruling will impact the free practice of religion pertaining to marriage. The court, in dicta contained in the ruling, offers consolation that religious organizations will continue to be free to teach their faith. In practice, however, 14th Amendment cases have been used to limit access to and benefits of government services otherwise available to organizations protected under the First Amendment. For example, organizations objecting to court imposed 14th Amendment requirements on the basis of First Amendment rights have been threatened with the loss of favorable tax or tax exempt status. The tension between First Amendment free exercise of religion interests and Fourteenth Amendment LGBTQ marriage interests will likely be resolved through future court cases or, possibly, a Constitutional amendment.

In the meantime, LGBTQ marriages will not be held at St. Mark's or officiated by your pastor. In accordance with local church policy on leadership expectations regarding sexual ethics and conduct, the pastor as well as other leaders are expected to be celibate in singleness and faithful in marriage. The term 'marriage' is used as defined by the Church, not the court. 'Leadership' is defined to include all church leaders as well as leaders of scout troops and other organizations chartered by or closely affiliated with St Mark's.

And finally, all people, regardless of sexual behavior and choices, are loved by God. We are all sinners in need of God's love and the grace of Jesus Christ. We welcome all persons to worship at St. Mark's and join us in the journey of becoming fully devoted followers of Jesus Christ.

Your help is needed to help provide both supplies and to help put packages together. You can bring your supplies anytime and deposit in church foyer or office. Then make plans to help put the kits together on July 25th.

Items needed in each kit:

1 hand towel

15" x 25" to 17"x 27"

kitchen, cleaning and microfiber towels not acceptable

1 washcloth

1 comb

comb needs to be sturdy and longer than 6" no pocket combs or picks, please rattail combs and combs without handles are acceptable with a minimum of 6" of teeth

1 metal nail file or clipper

no emery boards, please

1 bath-size soap

3 oz. and larger sizes only no Ivory or Jergens soap due to moisture content do not remove from original packaging

1 toothbrush

adult size only do not remove from original packaging



6 adhesive bandages

¾" to 1" size

common household Band-Aids

1 plastic bag

one-gallon size sealable bags only

Goal: 100 Health Kits

Important notes:

- All items must be new.
- Do not wash any of the items as they will be considered used.
- Please remove all packaging.
- All emergency kits are carefully planned to make them usable in the greatest number of situations. Since strict rule govern entry into international countries it is important that kits contain only items requested and nothing more.
- DO NO include any person notes, money or additional items.
- UMCOR is purchasing toothpaste in bulk to be added. Put any monies for toothpaste in separate envelopes and mark for toothpaste.
